As President of the Cancer Center Council, I would like to write this letter of recommendation on behalf of Leslie Mouton, who is an amazing and inspirational person and speaker.

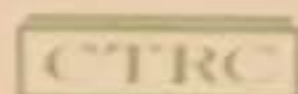


